## **Artist Biography**

Samantha Walrod graduated from the University of Alberta with her MFA in Visual Art in 2013; she

is a collage artist, painter and educator living in Edmonton Alberta. Her work can be found in various public and private collections across Canada, including the Alberta Foundation for the Arts Collection.

Walrod is best known for her figurative and still life collages; these depictions are either animal/human encounters or depictions of wilting flowers. Each body of work speaks to hope, loss, decay and the passage of time.

In response to the ubiquity of digital imagery, tactility is very important to the artist's practice. Images are incorporated with collage and digital technologies, while maintaining the intimacy of the artist's hand and the exploration of paint.

### **Artist Statement 2019**

Samantha Walrod's work is created in the studio after spending time in national, provincial and municipal parks. She recreates wilderness scenes through drawing, painting and collage mediums, which are mediated through the lenses of art history, popular culture and personal experience.

Walrod may visit Edmonton's river valley, Elk Island Provincial Park, or Banff National Park, but much of her lived experience is indoors. When in the studio, the memory of the outdoors is a fertile ground for expression. The mediation between experience and interpretation of that experience becomes the creative space for image making. Branches and flowers are depicted close up. They are a microcosm of synthetic colours and forms, which are abstracted by paint. Wild animals are reconstructed on canvas to approximate the experience of viewing them from a car. Each experience is a starting point for a collage or a painting, rather than a faithful reproduction.

Walrod considers what constitutes "wilderness", is it a space distinct from human culture or are people inextricably linked with these spaces? Through collage, her work addresses these fractured viewpoints. Photographic images have been torn apart and put back together again in a slightly off kilter way. The image is interrupted but remains intact. The act of collaging and reconstructing flora and fauna reminds us of the many cultural lenses that mediate our understanding of the outdoors, wilderness and nature.
