# The Edmonton Arts Prizes Eldon + Anne Foote Edmonton Visual Arts Prize

The Edmonton Arts Prizes celebrate artists from a range of art forms and practices, recognizing their work, and investing in their continued experimentation and creation.

With the shared aim to enhance Edmonton's reputation as a hub for extraordinary creation in the arts, the prize program is coordinated by the Edmonton Arts Council, in partnership with the City of Edmonton and our community partners: Alberta Media Production Industries Association, Alberta Music, Audrey's Books, CARFAC Alberta, Edmonton Community Foundation and Writers' Guild of Alberta.

# The 2022 Edmonton Arts Prizes

- Robert Kroetsch City of Edmonton Book Prize in partnership with Audrey's Books, and the Writers' Guild of Alberta
- City of Edmonton Music Prize in partnership with Alberta Music
- City of Edmonton Film Prize in partnership with the Alberta Media Industry Association
- The Eldon + Anne Foote Edmonton Visual Arts Prize in partnership with the Eldon + Anne Foote Fund at the Edmonton Community Foundation, and CARFAC Alberta

The partners are committed to their shared vision for the Edmonton Arts Prizes as a program that is inclusive of a wide range of artistic practices and welcomes the contributions of artists from multiple communities, backgrounds and traditions. We envision the arts prize categories growing in future years to include a greater diversity of arts disciplines.

# Shared eligibility and assessment criteria for the Edmonton Arts Prizes:

- Eligible artists/recipients must be residents of Edmonton and its immediate surrounding counties and Indigenous communities, commonly called the "Greater Edmonton Region" as defined by the Edmonton Community Foundation.
- Prize recommendations in each discipline will be based on an evaluation of the artistic merits of a specific work, or collection of work, by a knowledgeable group of peer assessors.
- Assessors will be charged with basing their decisions on the artwork's merits, including originality, creativity, relevance, and technical excellence. In all cases the prizes will attempt to recognize the highest standards of

artistic achievement, regardless of the artist's particular mode of expression, or style within the genre.

In the case of equivalent merits, the assessors will be encouraged to consider the work in the context of the (in order):

- 1. Artist's career
- 2. Relevant tradition(s), and arts practice in Canada
- 3. Representation of the demographic diversity of Edmonton's population
- 4. Representation of the diversity of artistic expression or styles within the discipline

Prizes will be awarded in the spring of 2023.

# Submission Guidelines for the Eldon + Anne Foote Edmonton Visual Arts Prize

In partnership with the Eldon + Anne Foote Fund at the Edmonton Community Foundation, and CARFAC Alberta

Submission deadline: 3pm Friday January 20, 2023

**Eldon + Anne Foote Edmonton Visual Arts Prize** recognizes artists, based on a single artwork shown in the Greater Edmonton area in the relevant 12 months (calendar year) prior to the deadline. An eligible visual artwork can be any object or installation publicly displayed, regardless of size, style, medium or materials.

# The 2023 Eldon + Anne Foote Edmonton Visual Arts Prize

The Eldon + Anne Foote Edmonton Visual Arts Prize was established with the generous support of the Eldon + Anne Foote Fund at Edmonton Community Foundation and in partnership with the Edmonton Arts Council and CARFAC Alberta.

This prize is open to Edmonton area artists nominated by an individual or gallery/organization located in the Greater Edmonton area (*Greater Edmonton*, as defined by the Edmonton Community Foundation, includes the City of Edmonton and its four surrounding counties and indigenous communities). Entries may be in any visual arts media and must have been shown in a Greater Edmonton area exhibition space during 2022 (January 1st, 2022 - December 31st, 2022) or in an online exhibition during that same time period. Submissions are judged by an independent jury selected by CARFAC Alberta. Submission deadline is Friday January 20th, 2023 at 3pm. The prize winners will be announced at a ceremony in spring 2023.

**PRIZE:** The winning artist will receive a **\$6,000** cash prize. The two other artists shortlisted for the Eldon + Anne Foote Edmonton Visual Arts Prize will receive **\$3,000** cash prizes.

#### **SUBMISSION GUIDELINES & RULES**

- Work submitted must be created by an artist living in the greater Edmonton area. Work
  produced by multiple artists is eligible if a majority of the participating artists are based in the
  greater Edmonton area.
- The artist(s) must be nominated by an Edmonton area individual or gallery/organization which showed at least one work by the artist(s) between January 1st, 2022 December 31st, 2022. No individual or gallery/organization may nominate the same artist(s) two years in a row, even for a different body of artwork. Previous recipients of the Prize are not eligible for re-nomination for three years following their prize year.
- Each individual or gallery/organization can nominate the exhibited work by the artist(s).
- Work submitted must have been shown in the Greater Edmonton area during, OR shown online between January 1st, 2022 December 31st, 2022.
- Work submitted may be in any visual arts media including, but not limited to: painting, sculpture, drawing, printmaking, photography and installation.
- If, in the opinion of the jury, no work submitted merits an award, no award will be given. In all cases, the jury's decision is final.







#### **SUBMISSION PROCEDURES**

Submissions must be mailed or hand delivered to CARFAC Alberta and received **by 3:00pm on Friday January 20<sup>th</sup>, 2023**. Late or incomplete submissions will not be considered. ## Submissions must include:

- A Nomination Form.
- A written description of the specific art work nominated and an explanation of why this art work has been nominated (three pages maximum, see Submission Checklist on page 5 for options).
- Digital images or a short video of the artist(s) art work (see Submission Checklist for file requirements).
- Artist(s) CV or comprehensive Biography (three pages maximum). Digital images or a short video of the art work in the exhibition space (see Submission Checklist for file requirements).
- One representative digital photographic image of the nominated art work (for publicity purposes).
- An Artist(s) Declaration Form.

## **SUBMISSION CRITERIA**

Awards will be based on the jury's evaluation of the art works artistic, historical and social merit. The jury may take into account their perception of the work in the context of the artist's career, in the context of relevant artistic tradition(s), and in the context of the practice of visual art in Canada. In all cases the jury will recognize exemplary art work, regardless of the artist's particular mode of expression. If, in the opinion of the jury, no art work in the competition merits an award, no award will be given. In all cases, the jury's decision is final.

	A completed Nomination Form (saved as artist last name NF; example: smithNF).
	<b>A written description</b> of the specific work nominated and an explanation of why this work has been nominated above all other eligible works. The written description portion can be completed by the artist, but an individual or gallery/organization representative must describe why this work/exhibition was chosen above all other eligible works, perhaps commenting on how the work engaged the community ( <i>Three pages maximum</i> ; saved as artist last name WD; example: smithWD).
	<b>A CV or comprehensive biography of the artist(s)</b> . Please include artist(s) website information here, if applicable (three pages maximum, saved as artist last name CV; example: smithCV)
	<b>An Artist(s) Declaration Form.</b> This document can be saved as .pdf or .jpg on the disk or printed out and enclosed with disk (if on disk, saved as artist last name D; example: smithD).
US	e above four documents can be saved as .doc, .rtf, .jpg or .pdf files. If you are submitting on a B flash drive, please enclose <b>one printed copy</b> of these documents with the flash drive. In dition to the above documents, please include in USB flash drive or single-link download:
	<b>One representative digital photographic image</b> of the specific nominated work (for publicity purposes only). Must be saved as a jpeg file at 300dpi and sized to approximately 8" × 10" or 10" × 8" (saved as artist last nameRI; example: smithRI). Will not be viewed by jury.
	<b>20 digital images</b> of the artist(s) artwork saved as a Powerpoint presentation, with artwork details (title, media, size, creation date) included on each slide (saved as artist last name PP; example: smithPP) or
	A five minute video of the artist(s) artwork. (saved as artist last name V; example: smithV). Video is only required for temporal works such as video, performance, moving sculpture etc.; it is not required for static works like painting, still sculpture, drawing, printmaking etc.
	An additional five minute video
	10 – 20 digital images showing the nominated artwork in situ to give the jurors a good sense of the work in its exhibiting space.
	Digital images must be saved in a Powerpoint presentation, with artwork details (title, media, size, creation date) included on each slide (saved as artist last name GS; example: smithGS).

## **ACCEPTABLE SUBMISSION FILE FORMATS:**

We will accept files in doc, .rtf, .jpg or .pdf formats. Video files must be Windows compatible, in .avi, .mov, .mpg, .mpeg or .mp4 format, viewable with QuickTime, Windows Media Player or VLC. Video can be a maximum of 1 GB file size.

#### **MAC USERS**

CARFAC Alberta uses Windows in our office, so we require submissions to be readable on our office setup. Fortunately, this is easy to accommodate from Mac OS.

**Keynote and Pages** can export presentations and documents to PowerPoint and Word formats respectively. In either program, choose **Export To** from the File menu, select either Power Point or Word, checking 'Advanced Options' and selecting .pptx or .docx file extensions.
